

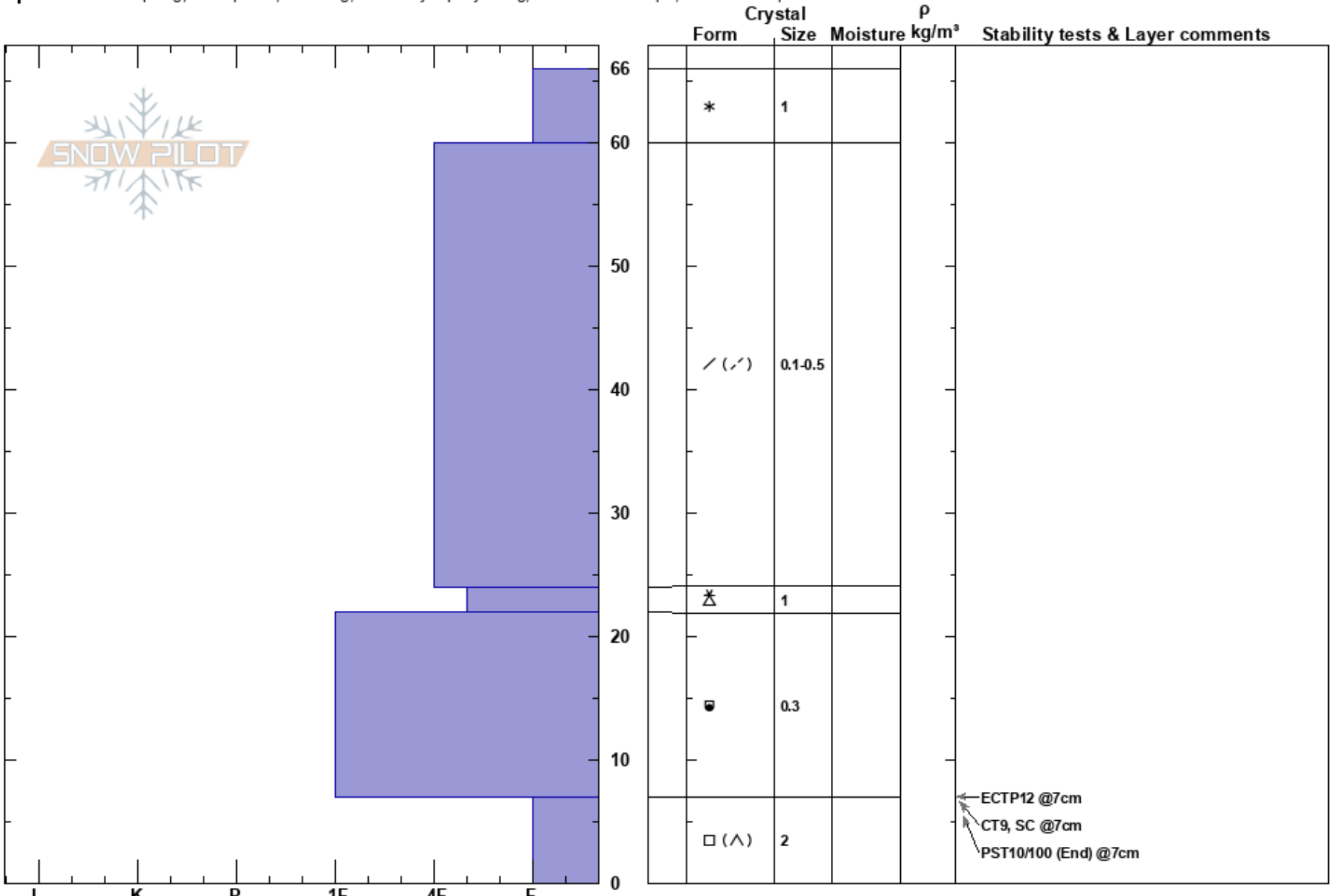

Notes: Quincy bowl is located just beyond the Daly Chutes at Deer Valley and is accessed by Empire Pass. While traveling on flat terrain I experienced a large, resounding collapse that. I skied a very low angle short shot and traveled out of the area on an old skin track that travels below a 10-15 degrees slope. While traveling on the old skin track I experienced more large collapses and saw some cracking on the steeper parts of that slope. Definitely was hair raising to watch some folks ski the nearby steeper terrain to the West, however they did not trigger anything. John Haney was also putting in some laps and for what it's worth said the skiing wasn't very good but still put in about 30 lap.
