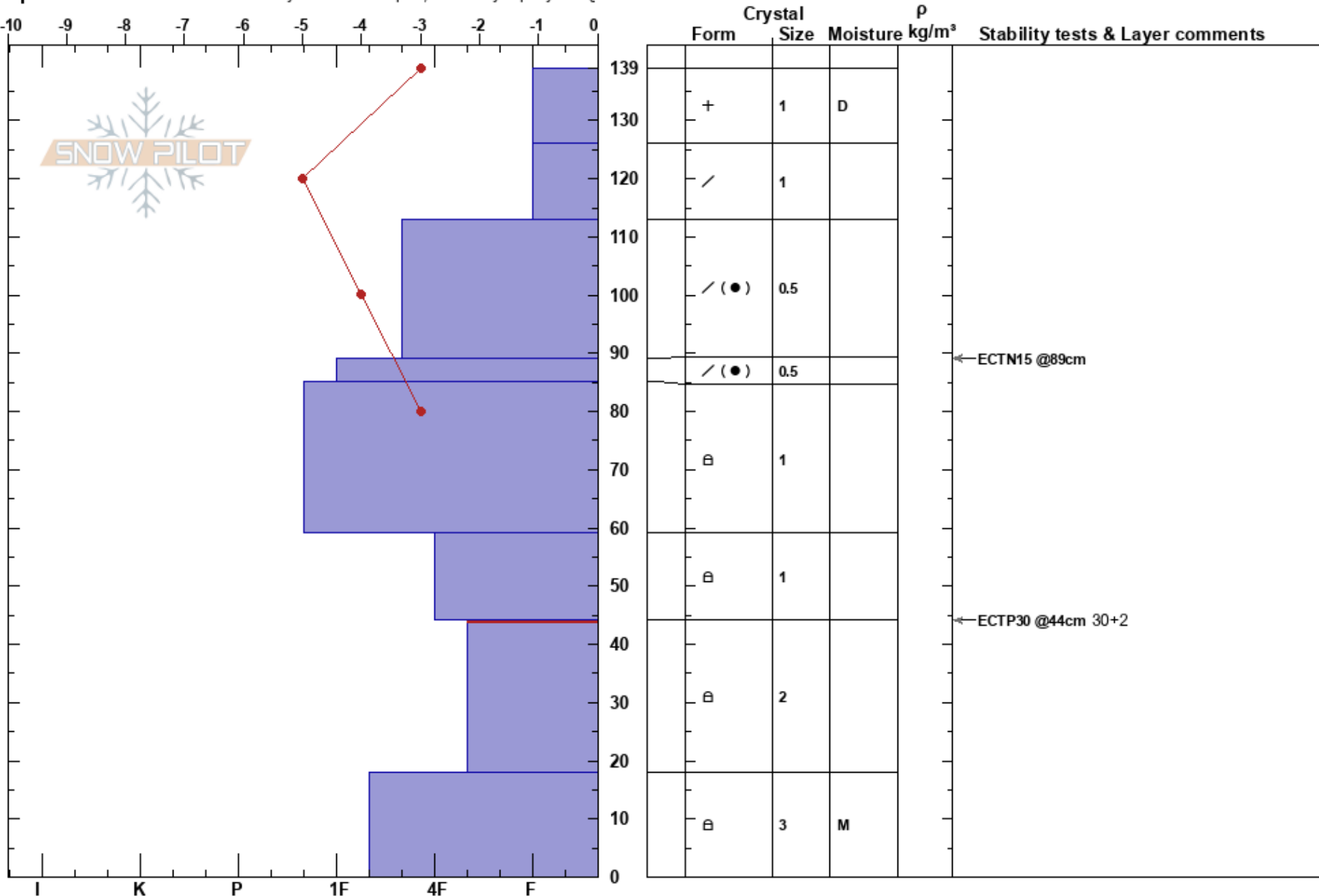

Notes: Storm began at 05:00 and deposited 13cm of 7% density so far. Winds are just beginning to shift to NW and snowfall rates are beginning to pick up. Stability in this zone seems far better than others at both similar elevations and aspects.

Clearly the low elevations have less scary facets near the ground. Still not ready to trust this type of structure on slope angle above 35 degrees?
