

Notes: This data point is located in closed terrain at the Mt Rose ski area. It is representative of the backcountry. The location is in upper Jackpot, 100' down the slope, on the skier's left side. I was unable to observe any Dec 16 storm snow (HSN 10cm in similar wind deposited locations). My theory is; NE winds scoured the Dec 16 snow before the Dec 20 storm arrived. The wide open nature and orography of this NE slope are favorable for a NE-wind to easily scour and transport new snow.
