

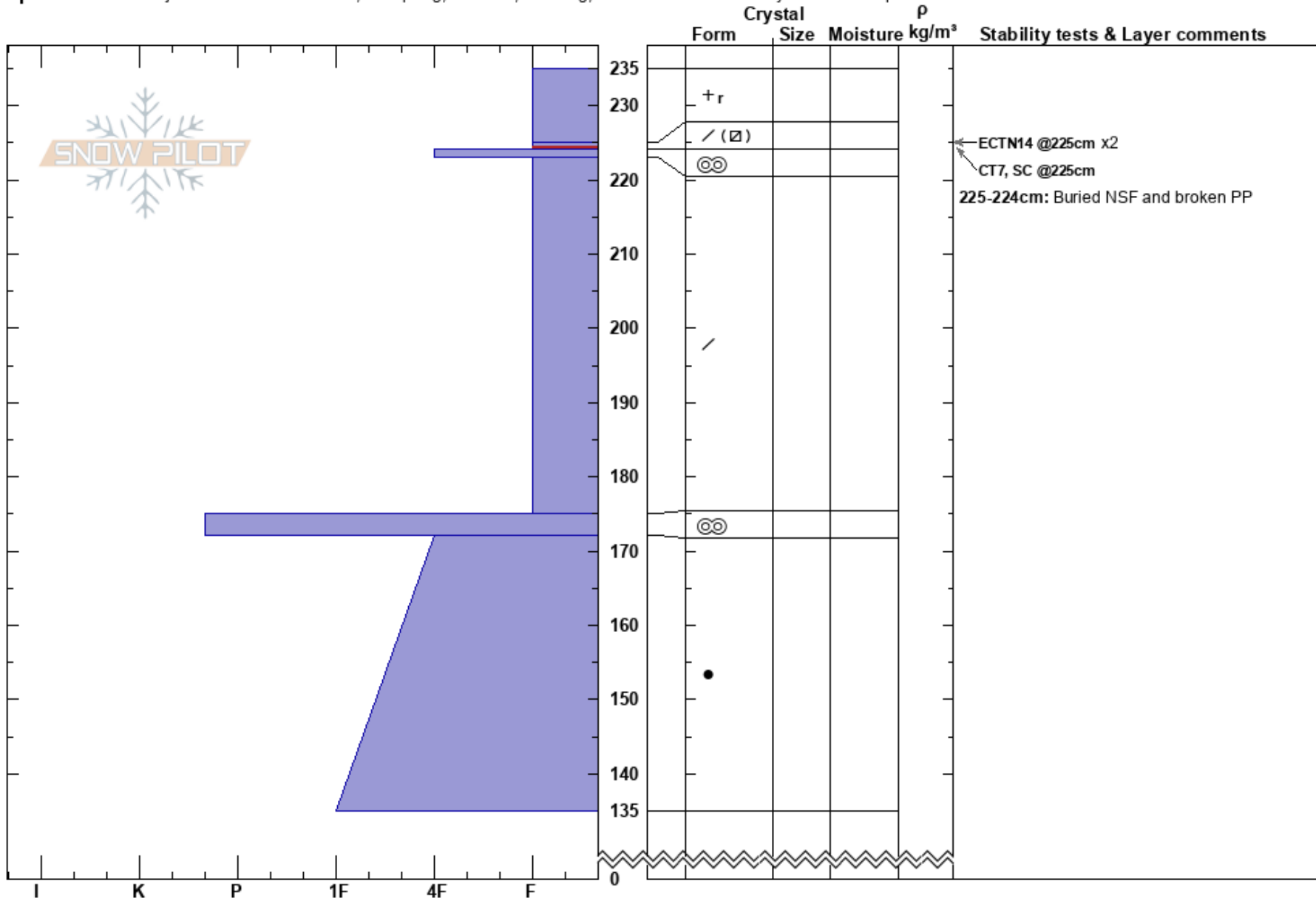

Specifics: Pit is adjacent to avalanche: other; Collapsing, localized; Cracking; Recent avalanche activity on similar slopes



Notes: Snowpit dug adjacent to an avalanche reported on February 17th. The pit location was a lower slope angle with less wind loading. There was a slight melt-freeze crust with small grained broken stellars with sharp edges above the crust. I think that right now to get an avalanche on this layer you need slope angle and some factor creating a denser slab (wind, sun, more snow).
