

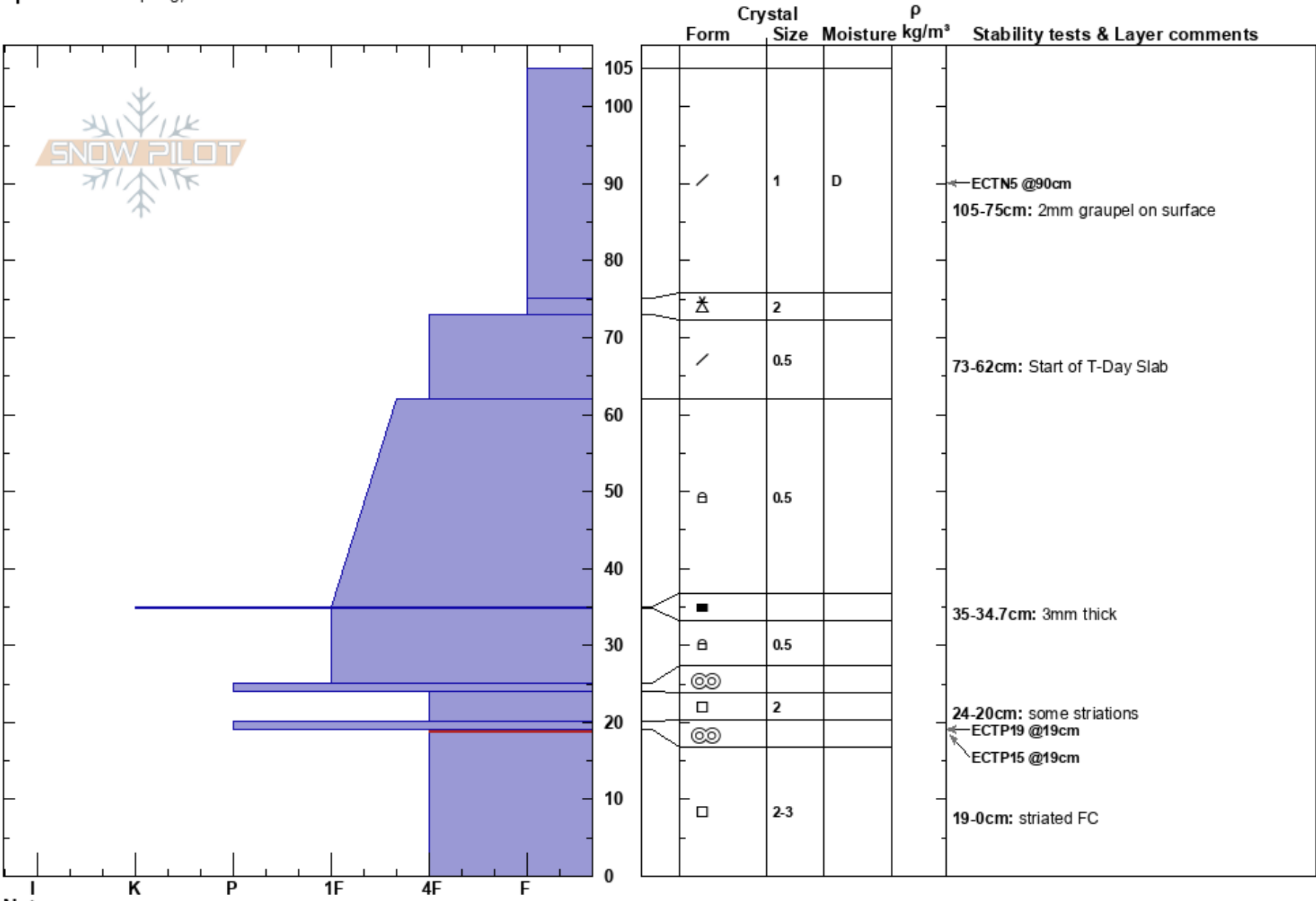

Notes: Karen Bockel's pit data. About 250' down the NE Ridge and dropping off to the north side. Snow depth was highly variable on the ridge and in the lee - varying between 30cm and 150cm. Upper elevation pits had a thin ice lens that was likely capping the October Snow. This pit had the largest facets that I have seen in the Teton Pass Area this season. One localized collapse as we reascended to the summit of Glory. Additional Layer Comments: 0-19cm: Problematic layer;
